JOHNSON POOL UPDATE (Theiles Manor) by Tara Gee, City of Roseville

- 100th Anniversary in 2021
- Renovations within the fenced area
- Create a nice entrance area
- This is a teaching swimming pool, but they will look at how to also incorporate extra activities
- They are planning to get rid of the slide, but they are open to discussion if people care
- Mechanical Room is very old so will need to be refurbished
- Pool Deck is old and cracking and needs TLC
- ADA Accessibility Improvements: Locker Room, Restrooms, etc.

- Maximize under-utilized spaces
- Because it's so hot at the pool, looking at incorporating shade structures.
- They have submitted for a grant to help with the \$3million price tag. They are looking at a variety of grants in case the one they have applied for doesn't work out.
- The pool will be open this summer for public swim if the COVID tiers allow. They are planning full speed ahead, with the understanding that things may have to change.
- Limited sign-up for swimming lessons because of COVID tiers. Water safety is key to Johnson Pool.
- Melinda asked if they already had a 100-year celebration, and they haven't really had a big one, no.
- Discussion ensued about a splash park, but Johnson Pool wouldn't be able to do that. Someone suggested what about a splash park at Saugstad?

SAUGSTAD PARK UPDATE by Tara Gee, City of Roseville

- This is an \$8million project and a grant was asked from the state granting source. They are competing with a lot of cities for these grant funds.
- Tara said Saugstad is built on a landfill, which makes for a challenge because things settle. It is also on a floodplain.
- They have discussed removing the old landfill, but the cost is prohibitive at \$15,000,000.
- Move dog park up front and have a big and small dog park
- Restroom
- Skatepark
- Fitness Court
- 4 Basketball Courts
- 4 Pickleball Courts
- ADA Updates
- Melinda mentioned that the water source in the park should be near the Dog Park. Currently, it's so far away.

ROYER PARK UPDATE

- New elementary school-aged playground - they are collecting ideas from children. A grant is paying for this.
- They want to finish the look of Royer to match the bridges.
- Courtyard by the Cook Shack.

OFFICER GEORGE TURKOV, Roseville Police Department

- Roseville always ranks as a great city.
- Jail is not accepting misdemeanor crimes for the past year and a half, so we may see more drug offenders and misdemeanor thefts, prowling, car thefts, catalytic converter thefts. Do not leave valuables in your vehicles. They get warrants and reports, but they never go to jail.
- There was a burglary at Sam's Club and they bailed out on Clinton and Darling a few weeks ago, and they were chased and finally caught because the jewelry they stole had a tracker on them. They were tracked to the jewelry and got the suspects.
- He shared about the FLOCK, which scans all license plates and takes pictures of all cars coming past it. They are based on all the entry and exit points of the city.
- Test drive vehicles from the dealerships is still a problem - he suggested we notify the Traffic Division of RPD. They do try to address the issue. We can also request a speed trailer to alert people.

- Mary Lee asked about the revving cars and street racing cars down Douglas. He wasn't aware of that, but heard the concern.

- 31,000 Vaccines have been given; 80% of older Placer County residents have received at least one vaccine.
